**BOLTWOOD, T.F.** Thomas Frederick BOLTWOOD, Driver, 102431, "B" Bty. Royal Horse Artillery. Thomas was born on 21 May 1899 in Wormley. His father Henry worked on the Wormleybury Estate. The family lived in one of the estate cottages in The Square at Wormley. He enlisted at Hertford and served with the Royal Horse Artillery and at 17 years of age, was the youngest inhabitant of the village to die in the conflict on 18th October 1916.
