The history of Civil Registration System (CRS) in India dates back to the middle of the 19th century. In 1886 a Central Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration Act began **voluntary** registration.

The Indian Census is the largest single source of a variety of **statistical** information on different characteristics of the people of India. Held every 10 years, beginning from 1872 when the first census was conducted in India.

The India Office Records are the archives of the administration in London of the East India Company and the pre-1947 government of India. The official archives of the India Office Records are complemented by deposits of private papers relating to the British experience in India. Many of these have been made available on the findmypast website:

#### Find My Past: British India Office Collection ( www.findmypast.co.uk )

Findmypast is a commercial family history website. It can be accessed free of charge through your local Hertfordshire Library, or at Hertfordshire Archives and Local Studies.

The British India Office collection is a rich resource for those with ancestors who lived and worked in India. The records span the seventeenth to the twentieth century and include records of the East India Company, military personnel and civil servants, as well as other professions such as surgeons who travelled to the sub-continent. Categories include:

#### British in India

Names of British people who either lived, worked or travelled in India from as early as 1664 up to 1961. This collection includes carefully indexed records of births, marriages, divorces and deaths.

#### British in India, Directories 1792-1948 Browse

Collection of army lists, civil lists, almanacs, and directories 1792 - 1948.

#### British India Office Army & Navy Pensions

Records and pensions of soldiers and sailors in the British East India Company as well as European soldiers and sailors in the British Indian Army and the Royal Indian Navy.

#### British India Office Deaths & Burials

Births and baptisms, marriages, deaths and burials of ancestors who lived or worked in India and other territories administered by the India office (Pakistan, Burma, Bangladesh, St Helena, Sumatra, Aden, Penang, Macao).

#### British India Office Wills & Probate

Wills and probate records of European soldiers and civilians who died in India and Burma.

#### British Subjects Who Died in the Service of the Indian Empire

British subjects who died in the service of the Indian Empire. From the digital images included, learn an individual's name, birth and death years, rank, regiment, and service history.

#### East India Company Madras Records Of Service 1741-1858

Records of service for the East India Company in the Madras Presidency from 1741 to 1858.

#### East India Company Pensions 1793-1833

Pension registers of ancestors who worked in India, Burma and other territories administered by the India Office with the British East India Company and the Civil Service.

Familysearch is an extensive website of family history information, created by the Church of Jesus Christ of the Later Day Saints (also known as the Mormon Church). It is free to use, but creation of a user log in and password is required.

Hindu pilgrimage records kept by Pandit Madhukar Balkrishan Akolkar at Trimbakeshwar, Maharashtra, India. They include records for people from Maharashtra, Gujarat, Punjab and Rajasthan, India. These records are created and updated when family members pass on. The registers are arranged by caste and contain native place, names of family members, the last occasion on which a family member came to this place of pilgrimage and made an entry in the register, the ceremony performed at the time and offering made to the priest. No women are mentioned unless their deaths are referred to indirectly.

Note: although these records are shown as being on Family Search, unless you are a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of the Laterday Saints you cannot view them.
